## **Newtownabbey company lands Chamber Awards success**

A pioneering engineering solutions firm is proving that 'Business is Good' for Northern Ireland after securing a major title at the regional heats of the Chamber Awards.

Williams Industrial Services (WIS) beat off challengers from across the country to win the Sustainability Award, impressing judges with its role in creating Glantek, a collaboration of companies working together to develop clean technology products and processes for waste treatment and renewable energy.

As a lead partner, the Newtownabbey firm works with B9 Organic Energy, Clinty Chemicals, Rural Generation Ltd and Silotank to deliver holistic solutions to everyday problems faced by communities across the world.

Outside of this collaboration, WIS has already secured a number of notable low carbon firsts, including the design, installation and commission of Northern Ireland's first indigenous Anaerobic Digestion plant at a value of £1.7m.
